*The objective of Lions Sunset Park Revitalization Project is to promote community health and wellness by improving areas for outdoor recreation in LaMoure, ND. In collaboration with city officials, the LaMoure Lions constructed a comprehensive recreational plan to develop a community park into a thriving gathering space that meets the diverse needs of multigenerational park patrons and visitors.*

*Phase one of this multi-phase project includes the purchase of essential playground equipment to develop a new play area at Sunset Park. Windstorms and time have led to the destruction and removal of significant structures over the past several years. The majority of*

*the remaining pieces do not meet current safety standards or the developmental needs of children younger than five. Visitors are left with few options for safe and engaging play. Developing the infrastructure for outdoor recreation would significantly benefit the community of LaMoure.*

*The 2013-2017 North Dakota State Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan identified that playgrounds and open space parks are a primary need among North Dakotans. This was echoed in a 2014 recreational needs assessment conducted by LaMoure Lions revealing that playground equipment was the primary need of citizens in LaMoure. Survey and focus group responses were utilized to develop this park improvement effort that will ultimately enhance the vitality of our community by creating space to safely enjoy outdoor recreation while becoming a necessary community asset for families considering making LaMoure their home.*

*To meet this need, LaMoure Lions partnered with the LaMoure Park Board, LaMoure Development Corporation, City officials and local volunteers to maximize efforts to revitalize Sunset Park into a thriving outdoor gathering space for every generation in our community.*

*The expected result of adding thoughtfully designed and inclusive play equipment to Sunset Park is that children and families, with a wide variety of physical and developmental needs, will have access to and enjoy a play experience that fosters social inclusion, learning and health. Furthermore, well-maintained parks add value to a community by increasing property value and serves as a mitigating factor for at-risk behaviors among youth who benefit from the pro-social elements a community park offers.*

*LaMoure serves as the county seat and host of many outdoor sporting events, educational opportunities and services; visitors to the community will utilize and benefit from the new play equipment. Future phases of the project including walking paths and off-street parking, will continue to improve access to outdoor recreation at Sunset Park for all who visit.*

*LaMoure Lions mission is to empower others to serve their communities. Chartered in 1961, LaMoure Lions is an organization of over 40 service-minded volunteers committed to creating positive, impactful change. Our Executive Board includes a President, Secretary and Treasurer and working committees oversee and implement the scope of our projects. The membership meets monthly to conduct a business meeting. Our Community Chest project raises thousands of dollars annually that are distributed in their entirety to 27 organizations in the community that share Lions’ mission of service. We offer two \$500 educational scholarships to high school students who demonstrate a passion for service through their volunteer efforts. Lions established the Chicken BBQ, 4-H BBQ, Alumni BBQ and Pancake Day to support local community social events that generate pride and cohesion and promote*

*local tourism. LaMoure Lions hold an annual eyeglasses drive to support Lions International's sight projects to prevent blindness and restore and promote eye health. Lions have joined forces with the LaMoure County Suicide Prevention Committee to offer mental health education resources and support throughout the county. The Lions Sunset Park Revitalization Committee was added in 2014 to address the need for improved facilities and access to outdoor recreation in LaMoure. We are a dynamic organization that serves widely, but always with the purpose of promoting citizenship and social welfare. We recognize the value that investing in outdoor recreation can have on an entire community through the preservation and growth of its city park.*

*The goal of the Sunset Park Revitalization Project to implement safe, innovative playground equipment is consistent with Directive D of the Outdoor Heritage Fund to create areas for recreation through the development of parks. This request includes the minimum 25% of match funding that is required and does not exceed the \$10,000 limit for the purchase of playground equipment.*

*Parks are hubs of social interaction and can help reduce stress and improve mental health. Playgrounds provide the infrastructure to enrich children's play and improve concentration. The goal of this project is to promote the collective physical, mental and social health of families that is supported through active play and engagement in the North Dakota outdoors. We believe that when families experience the pleasures of outdoor recreation, they will be motivated to sustain and protect our natural resources and future opportunities for conservation and outdoor recreation in North Dakota.*

*This is a new project and the urgency for funding exists. We need to provide citizens with a safe place to play outdoors and our current park does not meet the needs of families with very young children or those of persons with physical disabilities. Innovative and inclusive play equipment will significantly enhance visitors' recreational experience.*

*The plan for phase one includes the development of a new play area that is centrally located among the ball fields and also located near the restrooms to better meets the needs of park patrons identified by the LaMoure Park Board. You will see in our overall plan that cost estimates exceed that of the purchase of equipment included in this proposal. Fundraising efforts are currently in affect to address the additional costs associated with site preparation. Our strategy is to secure funding through grants, donations and city resources to ensure the success and maintenance of this project, which will in turn benefit the community for generations to come. We intend to implement this phase of the project through an innovative 'Community Build' process that involves community members of all ages and abilities joining together to turn an outdoor recreational dream into reality. The benefits will include community pride and ownership in a collective effort that contributes to the long-term vitality of LaMoure.*

The LaMoure Community Development Corporation is in support of the revitalization of Sunset Park that the LaMoure Lions and the City Park Board has undertaken for a community project.


We have seen improvements in the park over the last few years and are looking forward to the continued goal of giving Sunset Park the much-needed improvements that the plan presented to us entail.

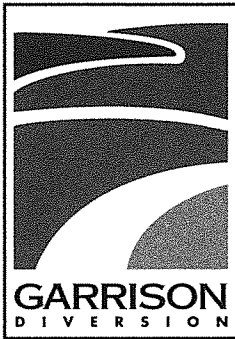

All playground equipment or product remains the property of Dakota Playground until paid for by Purchaser and Purchaser authorizes Dakota Playground to remove the same and charge Purchaser for the playground equipment or product and their removal if payment is not made per the terms of this Proposal. Purchaser agrees to pay 1.5% per month on all past due accounts.
