The park district intends to have the town dam dredged and stocked with fish. We expect that the dam will be functional and support fish from one season to the next. With help from the ND Game and Fish, the Glen Ullin Park Board intends to oversee this project to allow people of all ages, race and economic backgrounds a safe, cheap and easy access to an enjoyable hobby. With this new fishing opportunity, we hope to have people fishing on the shores of the town dam by the end of the summer.

Organization Information*:

The Glen Ullin Park District's mission is to provide recreation and park experiences that enhance the quality of life for our community, including benefits such as community health, social connections, and economic aspects for our resident families, businesses and visitors alike.

The Park Board is a 5-member elected board with a President in charge. There are two part-time permanent employees that oversee day to day operations.

The Park owns and maintains a 10.5-acre campground with 3 playgrounds and a log cabin that is open from April through October. In the park there is also a 7-target archery range with shooting from a tree stand or on the ground with various distances.

We also maintain an additional playground with basketball court and farmers market shelter in town. We have a baseball and softball diamond with a new concession stand, a grandstand and 4 dugouts.

Another attraction that will be promoted with the fishing is a 10-acre moto-cross track with an annual sanctioned race right next to the town dam that is part of this project.

The park 's endeavors are promoted and maintained with the part-time employees and many community volunteers along with extensive hours by the park board members.

Purpose of Grant*:

This new project will be part one of a two phase project. The summer of 2021 two parts of the dam area will be dredged to make the dam deep enough to stock the fish. The second phase will be to repair the dike on the dam.

There are not a lot of things for the residents of Glen Ullin to do in town. Most entertainment requires travel for at least 25 minutes. This project will be a free alternative to some of the more costly fishing or other summer time entertainment. This project will not only provide summertime fishing but ice fishing as well. As a smaller body of water, this will be an excellent place to ice fish. Along with fishing, small rowboats, kayaks and paddleboats can be used on the town dam. What a great way to spend a lazy summer afternoon.

This is a new venture, there hasn't been fishing at the town dam in over 45 years. Most of the retirees in Glen Ullin remember fishing there as children. Our children didn't have the option of taking an afternoon off to fish during the hot summer days but we hope that our grandchildren and future generations will be able to fondly recall their days fishing on the town dam.

With the motocross track right next door we hope that moto-cross rider's friends and family will come to Glen Ullin for practices and races and can fish while waiting. Why leave someone at home if they don't enjoy motocross when they could come to Glen Ullin and fish right next door? Moto-cross and fishing can be yearlong hobbies that we hope will draw many people to town. We have already seen an influx of visitors with the track and we anticipate that fishing will draw even more people.

We firmly believe that this grant satisfies all the grants directives A, B, C & D. This is an undeveloped, public, natural wildlife habitat and will be an excellent recreation area. With the dam dredged it should increase the water quality thereby allowing wildlife and fish to thrive. In order to preserve the natural habitat we need to provide bathrooms for all users. With designated picnic shelters we can contain the garbage that comes from people eating their lunches outdoors.

Vice-President: Kent Glasser is the plant manager at Red Trail Energy and also provides good leadership on any of our projects. He has served on the park board since 2016.

Board Member: Jerrid Soupir, Engineer, CEO of Hebron Brick is a critical thinker that can help solve any problem that comes up. He has served on the park board since 2004.

Board Member: Adam Schantz is a farmer that has great ideas on how to make things work. He has served on the park board since 2020

Park District Clerk: Vicki Horst is also the city auditor and has worked and completed many projects that were funded by local, regional, state and federal grants. She has served as the park district clerk since 2008.

The bathrooms and shelters will be used for dam activities and moto-cross activities and will require little maintenance each year. Our park caretaker will be able to maintain and fix any issues with these facilities each year.

Dear North Dakota Industrial Commission:

I am writing to express the North Dakota Game and Fish Department's wholehearted support for Glen Ullin Park Board's North Dakota Outdoor Heritage Fund grant. We strongly support this grant application and its focus on outdoor recreation. They are trying to build an outdoor fishery where no fishery exists for 30 miles. Especially in the western part of the state where it is habitually dry this project will create deeper water habitat for fish throughout the open water months and may even give the fish the possibility of overwintering.

We believe establishing Glen Ullin Pond will be an extremely good fit into their already vast array of facilities in the community. This will be especially important for the children, elderly and less mobile individuals of Glen Ullin as it will be close to them and easily accessible. Comprehensive Conservation Plan

The Glen Ullin Park District has a long history of providing facilities and services for our community. We have, in the local community, parks, baseball/softball complex, Little League baseball program, motocross course, golf course, archery range, shelters, campground, playgrounds and a museum. The establishment of a fishery would only add to the recreational opportunities we now provide. We have the support of the North Dakota Game and Fish Department and they have assisted us with the plans and specifications for the establishment of deeper water habitat and the project as a whole. These facilities will be fully accessible to young and old at all times with little to no travel restrictions. Facilities like these are integral for the family unit, especially in North Dakota's smaller communities such as Glen Ullin.

Mission Statement: The Glen Ullin Park District's mission is to provide recreation and park experiences that enhance the quality of life for our community, including benefits such as community health, social connections, and economic aspects for our resident families, businesses and visitors alike.

All current and future projects must support our mission statement and all new permanent structures must preserve and protect the environment and wildlife habitat while appearing natural to their setting.

Current plans:

- 2021 Dredge and stock town dam with fish, build shelters & restrooms, add dock
- 2021 Stain and paint log cabin in park
- 2021 Motocross race-August
- 2022 Add water and a bathroom addition to concession stand
- 2023 Repaired and strengthen the town dam
- 2023 Add playground equipment to Sunshine Park
- 2024 Plant trees near picnic shelters
- 2024 Add playground equipment to
- 2024 Plant trees along west side of concession stand

Long term plans:

- 2025 Explore and develop walking trail along town dam
- 2025 Plant native grasses where necessary in park, town dam and moto-track
- 2030 Plant shelter belt on NW side of dam & along parking areas
- 2030 Add riprap as necessary to town dam

Funding:

The golf course, moto-cross and campground are all self-funded. All other projects are funded through grants with annual maintenance done through our mill levy from local property taxes.
