

It has been a difficult spring to coordinate volunteer efforts as the weather has challenged us on the weekends that were available. We purchased the bulk of material for the project in April with an arrival date before our camp improvement days. We were fortunate in receiving a substantial discount on the initial order that has allowed us to buy more than we anticipated.

Inspiration Area



The camp added a campfire site to the area near the area of inspiration. The ring and site preparation took place late last fall and was accomplished by our maintenance person. This was accomplished in two hours.



The bench frames were built off site by staff in April and the benches were completed on site on May 10 and May 28 by 4 volunteers and staff. Time to put together the benches was 42 hours. The inspiration meeting site roof shingling has not been completed yet due to delay in shipping of

materials.

Walking Trails

We mulched the main walking trails along the Missouri River on May 20 - 21 with the help of 12 volunteers and 7 extension staff along with a bobcat. The upper trail along our ravine was mulched on June 12 also with the help of staff and volunteers. Site prep and application was completed by volunteer and staff. Work hours was 96 hours.

Garden Plan

NRCS was contacted to develop a plan for the native plant and butterfly gardens in April. The final plan was accepted and initiated on May 8 by our camp development committee. The 40' by 157' terrace by the area of inspiration was sprayed by our maintenance person as instructed by the NRCS plan and the wall for soil retention was designed and marked out by extension staff. This was completed in 12 hours. We will go over our inkind match hours especially with the garden.

The wall construction will be complete this week. However, planting is still in progress, (June 28) but should be done in the first weeks of July. The site will have small trees for birds and nesting. We are using native plants of the upper Midwest which include species that pollinate at different times to provide our butterflies and other species of pollinators a timed prolonged source of food. We have constructed butterfly four houses to place near the garden area. The main garden site will include a paver walking trail through it and benches to sit and do observations.
