It is the goal of the Grand Forks Park District to offer year-round park use and fishing activities at Ryan Lake for the all ages. Prior to the generous granting of the Outdoor Heritage Fund, the Ryan Lake area was only available for use and recreational fun 4-5 months out of the year due to the inability for fish to sustain life during the cold winters in the shallow lake conditions. In addition, cattails and overgrowth limited public access to the Ryan Lake shoreline making it difficult for the community to have access to the water.





From the funds given to us by the Outdoor Heritage Grant, the Grand Forks Park District has been able to dredge Ryan Lake in order to increase the depth and water volume. The dredging has allowed us to create a better habitat for fish. Not only has it helped strengthen the fish population, but it will help the Grand Forks Park District offer fishing activities year round to our community.



Removal of excess plant material and cattails along with placement of erosion barrier and rip rap along the shoreline has also been completed. This ability to open up the shoreline while protecting the habitat has made access to the lake much easier.





As part of our commitment to improving Ryan Lake, the Grand Forks Park District, along with community supporters, have built two picnic shelters, installed two educational kiosks, completed the walkway, installed benches and hosted a Family Fishing Day Annual Event.
