In August of 2015, the Urban Woods and Prairies Initiative has been focused on progressing project implementation, management of weed species, and observing the establishment of native species.

The scope of the project continues to grow as more sites are deemed appropriate for restoration work. What started as a 6 site project in Fargo has expanded to be nearing 25 different sites within the Fargo-Moorhead area. Encompassing nearly 1,000 acres of wetlands, grasslands, and woodlands, the Urban Woods and Prairies Initiative has worked with city governments and park districts, counties and watershed districts, and local groups and organizations to find ideal sites to restore to natural vegetation.

In terms of seeding and establishment, the Industrial Commission and the Outdoor Heritage Fund distributed funding for the establishment of 5 sites. To date, site preparation, seeding, and establishment have occurred on all 5 of those sites. The Fargo Park District has completed the site prep work for these 5 sites. Their site prep methods (in accordance with the guidelines described by Prairie Restorations) included mowing, herbicide application, and ground work where it was realistic (on land that was flat and at small risk of erosion, full disking of the land was done; on areas that were sloped or at risk for erosion, a light harrow was used to scratch the surface and stimulate weed growth). Before seeding could commence, weed management was essential which led to a final application of herbicide. After the weeds died, Prairie Restorations utilized a Truax seed drill to seed directly into the prepared seedbed. Within the last month, management of recovering weed species has been performed by mowing the 5 sites. A sign of successful preparation and management has come from the emergence of the native grass species at all 5 sites (pictures attached).

The next phase of this project, in terms of the Outdoor Heritage Fund, is to continue to monitor avian and vegetation at the sites and retain valuable data and records about each. This will be done as an in-kind match through Audubon Dakota. Continued maintenance and management is required on the sites to ensure that the seeding and establishment properly takes to the soil. Audubon Dakota will continue to provide avian and vegetation reports to the Industrial Commission in accordance to the grant contract.
