Work Completed during Period Covered by Report: (This information will be posted on the Outdoor Heritage Fund/Industrial Commission website)

In May, June, and July of 2015, the Urban Woods and Prairies Initiative has been focused on project implementation, site preparation, and seeding and establishment.

The scope of the project continues to grow as more sites are deemed appropriate for restoration work. What started as a 6 site project in Fargo has expanded to be nearing 25 different sites within the Fargo-Moorhead area. Encompassing nearly 1,000 acres of wetlands, grasslands, and woodlands, the Urban Woods and Prairies Initiative has worked with city governments and park districts, counties and watershed districts, and local groups and organizations to find ideal sites to restore to natural vegetation. OHF's partnership has been a real catalyst for this project growth.

In terms of seeding and establishment, the Industrial Commission and the Outdoor Heritage Fund distributed funding for the establishment of 5 sites. To date, site preparation, seeding, and establishment have occurred on all 5 of those sites. The Fargo Park District has done the site prep work. Their site prep methods (in accordance with the guidelines described by Prairie Restorations) included mowing, herbicide application, and ground work where it was realistic (on land that was flat and at small risk of erosion, full disking of the land was done; on areas that were sloped or at risk for erosion, a light harrow was used to scratch the surface and stimulate weed growth). The next step for these sites was to wait for the flush of new weeds and then apply one more application of herbicide. The herbicide was applied and after those weeds died, Prairie Restorations was able to come in and seed directly into the prepared seedbed. All seeding was done with a Truax seed drill and mowing and maintenance activities were done in accordance to management plans.

The next phase of this project, in terms of the Outdoor Heritage Fund, is to continue to monitor avian and vegetation at the sites and retain valuable data and records about each. This will be done as an in-kind match through Audubon Dakota. Continued maintenance and management is required on the sites to ensure that the seeding and establishment properly takes to the soil. Audubon Dakota will continue to provide avian and vegetation reports to the Industrial Commission in accordance to the grant contract.
