Work Completed during Period Covered by Report:

Since the last reporting period, it was discovered that three invoices from Frank Redlin totaling \$28,956.01 and one invoice from Nicolette Flann totaling \$30,920.40 (grand totaling \$59,876.41 in expenses) were incorrectly recorded as cash match instead of billable to OHF grant funds. Correcting journal entries were completed on 6/30/2020. As a result, after adding in \$27,263.71 of current landowner cash match, current cash match reflected in this reporting period is negative \$32,612.70.

During the reporting period of 1/1/20-9/30/20, Audubon Dakota continued to enroll and implement the Stutsman County Prairie Management Toolbox through grazing infrastructure installation, prairie restoration, and invasive species removal. North Dakota OHF dollars supported the following projects in Stutsman County:

## **Grazing Infrastructure:**

- Sherry Kramlich/Leona Moser: \$33,812.49, 410 acres.
  - Fencing and livestock water development on high quality native prairie.
- Delbert Schuette: \$8,747.91, 28 acres
  - Fencing was installed to allow stocking cattle on grass that had never been grazed.

## **Prairie Restoration:**

- Frank Redlin: \$8,843.40, 91 acres
  - A native seed mix was interseeded into an existing degraded stand of grass.

## **Invasive Species Control:**

- Irene Paasch: \$300, 51,5 acres.
  - Russian olives invading a native grassland planting were pulled and cut by a local contractor.

Additionally, during the 2020 summer, Audubon Dakota staff completed avian and vegetation surveys at 15 project sites to evaluate the applied management impact to site diversity and inform further habitat management decisions. The staff encountered almost 1800 birds with an average of 14 different species per transect among 39 transects. Seven of the 10 Audubon priority bird species for the Dakotas were found on project sites. One of them, the Western Meadowlark, was recorded 92 times. The highest number and density of this species were found on sites with completed projects.
