In 2018, the North Dakota Grassland Restoration Project (NDGRP) grant was approved to create a partnership between private landowners, USFWS's Partners for Fish and Wildlife (PFW) program, and North Dakota Natural Resources Trust (Trust) to restore grasslands that would enhance soil conditions, provide forage for livestock and provide wildlife conservation habitat.

The NDGRP grant proposal stated that it would assist landowners with the cost-share for grass seed to restore grasslands. The goal of NDGRP was to work with landowners to restore 2,000 acres of grassland within 3 years to benefit wildlife species and grassland agricultural.

During this status report the NDGRP made the final two landowner cost-share payments in McHenry and Burleigh Counties that restored 137.50 acres of grassland.

The NDGRP grant is fully completed, accomplishing 2,720.19 acres of grassland restoration in 13 different counties with 20 landowners. The grant agreement with ND Industrial Commission was signed December, 2018 and the final payment was made in June, 2021. A final report will be submitted soon.
