Work Completed during Period Covered by Report:

Since receiving the OHF grant award for the Central Coteau Prairie Management Toolbox, Audubon Dakota has cooperated with Ducks Unlimited and Burleigh, Sheridan, and Mclean County Soil Conservation Districts to identify landowners that would benefit from the Toolbox program.

To date, Audubon Dakota has entered into agreements for grazing infrastructure and prairie restoration projects with 3 landowners. Additionally, Audubon Dakota Range Ecologists are in the process of completing agreements with 4 landowners for new projects. Combined, these 7 agreements enroll 3,027 acres in the Toolbox program. Agreements range in length from five to ten years and ensure the habitat is managed as grassland habitat for the full contract term.

One grazing infrastructure project has been fully completed; providing a source of water to allow cattle grazing on 160 acres of land and creating an additional pasture to be part of a rotational grazing system. The total cost of the project was \$6,938, with the landowner responsible for \$2,775. Two additional grazing infrastructure projects are underway in 2019 and are expected to be completed in 2020. The estimated total costs of those projects is \$144,702 with a landowner contribution of \$57,881.
